SUBJECT: Standalone Refrigerator and Freezer Requirement 2023

The Louisiana Immunization Program wishes to inform you of new Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program requirements to ensure proper vaccine storage and handling practices. **Effective July 1, 2023**, the VFC Program will require that, if you use *household* refrigerators and freezers for storing VFC vaccine, the refrigerator and freezer be separate, <u>standalone</u> units. The National Institute for Standards and Technology (NIST) has determined the freezer section of household combination units **are <u>not</u>** capable of reliably maintaining appropriate frozen vaccine storage temperatures.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Louisiana Immunization Program recommend the following for VFC storage units (listed in order of preference):

- Purpose-built or pharmaceutical/medical-grade unit, including doorless and dispensing units
- Standalone refrigerator and freezer units these units can vary in size from a compact, under-the-counter style to a large, standalone, pharmaceutical-grade storage unit
 - <u>NOTE</u>: Some manufacturers offer purpose-built, biologic/pharmaceutical-grade combination refrigerator/freezer units. CDC approves the use of both the refrigerator and freezer sections of these types of units for vaccine storage.
- Combination household refrigerator/freezer unit, using <u>only</u> the refrigerator compartment to store vaccines a separate standalone freezer must then be used to store frozen vaccines

Use of the freezer compartment of a household combination unit is not allowed.
